For me, it's the little things that matter. The little things can bring as much or more joy than something big. Here are some of the little things that bring me joy!


- Students who help in the lunchroom without being asked.

SALT Opportunities

Each family (K-8th) is asked to serve 25 volunteer hours each year. This can also be donated to the school at a rate of \$20/hour. Here are some available options for serving:

Parents are responsible for recording their SALT hours. The notebook for recording hours is in the school office.

Half of your SALT hours (12.5 hours = \$250) are due by January 19th or will be charged to your TADs account in February. Any unfinished second half of your SALT will be assessed in April and added to your last TADs payment in May.


