# **Principal's Corner**

Does it sometimes seem like we live in a rude world?

- 8 out of 10 American adults say a lack of respect and courtesy is a serious problem.
- 6 out of 10 say things are getting worse.
- More than 4 out of 10 admit they sometimes behave pretty badly themselves.

What's the big deal about manners, anyway? So what if people sneeze on you, kick your seat during a movie, cut in front of you in line, hog the dessert at a potluck or spread nasty rumors?

You might not think it matters at first, but it can sneak up on you later when you see the reaction of others and it's your child people are reacting to.

When you have manners, you know how to act in all kinds of situations. You don't have to guess or wonder if you're doing something wrong. That can build your confidence. When your child is polite at home, at school, and everywhere else you go, people will notice. They will see that the child is thoughtful, great to know and fun to be around. Manners make life easier and nicer for everyone. Manners are a happy way of doing things.

Often we save our "nice" manners for others and kick back at home. Doesn't your family deserve the best?

- 1. Children talk to their parents. Say "good morning" and "good night."
- 2. Respect the privacy of others. Don't listen in on phone conversations, read others' mail, or snoop in their closets.
- 3. Knock gently on a closed door before entering.
- 4. Use good table manners.
- 5. Borrow items only if they've asked to do so. Return them in good condition.
- 6. Spend time with their siblings. Don't hibernate in the bedroom.
- 7. Ask family members how things are going.
- 8. Use an "indoor voice" when they're in the house.
- 9. Pick up after themselves.
- 10. Don't let their goodbyes be accompanied by unkind words.
