

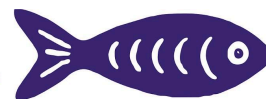

The teachers and staff have noticed a significant increase in the number of students who bring energy or caffeinated beverages to school. Students as young as 3rd grade are coming to school in the morning with a drink from the coffee shop. These drinks not only have a lot of caffeine, but also a lot of sugar. They may taste good, but this isn't setting your child up for a strong start to their day.

The American Academy of Pediatrics say that caffeine and other stimulant substances found in energy drinks have no place in the diets of children and adolescents.

A big concern is that energy drinks contain significant amounts of caffeine. Many contain as much as 200 milligrams of caffeine per serving (12 or 16 oz), which is equivalent to six 12-ounce cans of soda.

Too much caffeine can cause heart palpitations, elevated blood pressure, anxiety, upset stomach, insomnia, nervousness and irritability. No one wants this!

All of this caffeine and sugar make it so difficult for students to focus during class. The best approach to reducing caffeine intake is to first take note of how much your child is drinking, then gradually reduce the amount. If your child does enjoy a moonshine from Copper Mountain or a Bubbler in a can, this should be a rare treat and certainly not an every day occurrence.

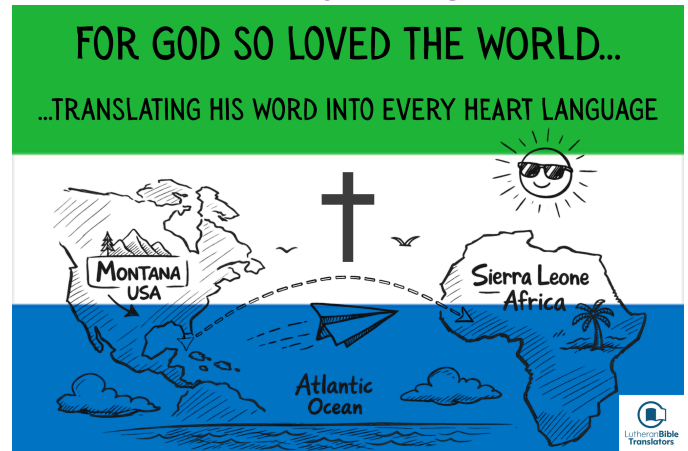

## New Classes for the 2026-2027 School year

We are so excited to share with you two new classes that will be offered in the fall. Registration and re-enrollment for current families begins Monday March 2, and opens to the public on Monday, March 9!

Little Learners - In our Little Learners class, our youngest students will explore the world around them through play, and hands-on learning. Through activities, stories, songs, and prayer, Little Learners will be introduced to Jesus and His love for them. This class will ignite curiosity and a love of learning. Little Learners is for children who are 3 years old by September 10 and potty trained. The class will be Tuesday and Thursday mornings.

Jr. Kindergarten - For some students, the step between pre-kindergarten into kindergarten can be a big leap. Jr. Kindergarten offers a nice in-between step. This class will be 5 half days and will be offered in the afternoons. Additional pre-reading and math skills will be offered as well as kindergarten preparedness. ## ACE Scholarship Renewal/Application

### PROGRAM INFORMATION

APPLICATION OPEN FEB. 2 – APRIL 15, 2026

→ **WHO WE ARE**  
Our vision is that every child has access to a quality education. Since 2012, ACE has provided 11,459 scholarships to children from lower-income families totaling \$24,908,049 and teamed up with approximately 40 partner schools across the state.

→ **WHAT WE DO**  
Our mission is to advance K-12 educational freedom, with a focus on securing financial support for families so they may access the quality education of their choice.


→ **QUALIFICATIONS FOR STUDENTS**  
ACE scholarships are based solely on the family's total income both taxable (line 9 on the 1040 for those who file) and nontaxable. See the chart below for ACE Scholarships' financial eligibility breakdown by household size.

→ **SCHOLARSHIP AWARD AMOUNTS**  
ACE scholarships are partial tuition, intended to provide the added assistance lower-income families may need to enroll their child in a private school. Standard ACE award amounts are \$3,000 for K-8 and \$4,000 for high school (9-12). Awards are capped at 50% of the school's listed annual tuition. Families are responsible for working out a payment plan with the school for the remainder of the tuition.



**Changing Education Changes Everything**

→ **PARTICIPATING SCHOOLS**  
A wide variety of private schools participate in the ACE scholarships program. It is up to the families of potential scholarship recipients to determine the school that is the best fit for their child.

→ **AN ACE SCHOLARSHIP CAN FOLLOW YOUR CHILD**  
If your child is awarded a scholarship, those funds are portable if transferred before funds are sent to the school and may be used at any ACE partner private school. So, if the private school you select ends up not being the right fit, you can transfer your child to another private school, and the scholarship goes with them.

→ **APPLICATION INSTRUCTIONS**  
[ The application for an ACE scholarship is completed online at <https://portal.acescholarships.org/ace> ]

Families of students provided a scholarship the prior year will be charged a \$10 fee per application whereas applicants who do not have a student receiving a scholarship in the prior year will be charged a \$25 fee. The application will be open Monday, February 2, 2026 through Wednesday, April 15, 2026 at 11:59 pm (in the time zone the school resides).



**FOR FAMILIES NEW TO THE SCHOLARSHIP OPPORTUNITY**

1. Identify the right ACE partner private school for your child. Complete the school's application and enrollment process for your child.
2. Confirm that you qualify for a scholarship based on the financial guidelines listed in the chart provided. Complete the ACE Scholarships application for your student(s). You must complete an application for ACE Scholarships separate from your school application.
3. Answer all application questions, attach required documentation, and submit. You may begin an application and save and return at any time. Applications must be complete and submitted before the April 15 deadline for the students to be considered for awarding.

**FOR FAMILIES WITH A STUDENT CURRENTLY RECEIVING AN ACE SCHOLARSHIP**

1. Complete the school's application and enrollment process for your child.
2. Complete the ACE Scholarships application for your student(s). You must complete an application for ACE Scholarships separate from your school application, but returning families **do not** need to requalify based on income. Simply answer all application questions, verify your information is correct, and submit. You may begin an application and save and return to your progress at any time, but applications must be complete and submitted before the April 15 deadline for the students listed on the application to be considered for awarding.
