#### Principal's Corner

As summer comes to an end and back to school season begins, it can be hard to get back into the rhythm of a regular schedule - for both kids and adults. The trick, of course, is to plan ahead. Start preparing everyone now to have a successful first day of school.

Here are a few tips you may find helpful:

- 1. Set sleep schedules back to "school time" two days before the start of school.
- 2. Encourage your children to read everyday between now and the start of school.
- 3. Let your child choose a planner or scheduling tool that they're excited to use.
- 4. Have a back up transportation plan in case you can't make it in time for pick-up.
- 5. Cut back or eliminate screen time.
- It's helpful for younger students to practice eating lunch. Can he open containers? Can she complete her lunch within 20 minutes? Encourage your child to throw away their own trash and clean up after themselves.
- 7. Make mornings hassle free by doing as much as possible the night before: pack lunches, lay clothes out, place backpacks by the door.
- 8. Establish a specific place for homework to be completed.
- 9. Ask your child to set goals for themselves for this school year.
- 10. Pray with and for your children!

## **Blue Polos**

Blue Polos will **not** be required on the first day of school. The church is going through a process of acquiring a new logo. We were hopeful this logo would be available for shirts before the start of school, but no luck. The plan is for the school to purchase iron-on logos that we can pass onto our families. In the meantime, we recommend you purchase a navy blue polo from Old Navy, JCPenney, Gap, Target, Walmart or Lands End. It will be ok if the shirt doesn't have a logo at the start of school. We will also accept the old logo design so students can wear their shirt from last year.

### **New Teacher Welcome**

On September 10 we will also welcome Catherine O'Brien, our new first grade teacher, Hannah Howard our choir teacher, and Daniel Freeman our band instructor. Please give a warm Trinity welcome with cards, gift cards, Montana gifts, household items etc.

## **Band Teacher**

We are pleased to welcome Mr. Daniel Freeman as our band instructor for 5th - 8th grade students. Mr. Freeman also works for Whitefish school district as an elementary music teacher.

This year, we are inviting Flathead Woodwinds and Brass, a local instrument vendor, to our welcome back BBQ. Representatives will let students try instruments and provide parents an opportunity to set up a rental contract for the instrument of their choice. The school will provide a free instrument to any families that do not wish rent an instrument, but renting an instrument has many advantages including:

- Your student is guaranteed to be able to play the instrument of their choice rather than what is available through the school.

- It is a rent-to-own program meaning your family will eventually own the instrument.

- Your student's instrument will travel with them to high school when they finish 8th grade.

- All instruments are high-quality, name-brand instruments

- A low-cost maintenance plan is available. This is highly recommended.

While sticker prices on the rental plans may be prohibitive, they are due to the high cost of quality instruments. For more information on the rental program, please visit

## **Attendance**

Attendance is an indicator of student success. It is important for your child to be in school and on time every day.

Please note Trinity's attendance policy:

Trinity Lutheran School's academic program is designed to support in-person instruction. When a student is frequently absent, undue strain is placed on the learning experience for the student, the class, and the teacher.


Students who are absent more than **20 days in one** academic year (or 20 periods from the same class) for any reason other than school-sanctioned events may be asked to leave Trinity because of the stress the absences place on the Trinity community. When the student has reached **10** absences, the family will be required to meet with the classroom teacher and the principal. Failure to meet after 10 absences will put your student's enrollment in jeopardy.

Please keep this in mind when scheduling appointments and vacations during the school year.

### **GoGuardian**

Trinity has adopted GoGuardian, a platform for monitoring student devices. This will be used in our middle school. Our teachers will receive training before the start of school and you will certainly hear more about this at the start of school.
